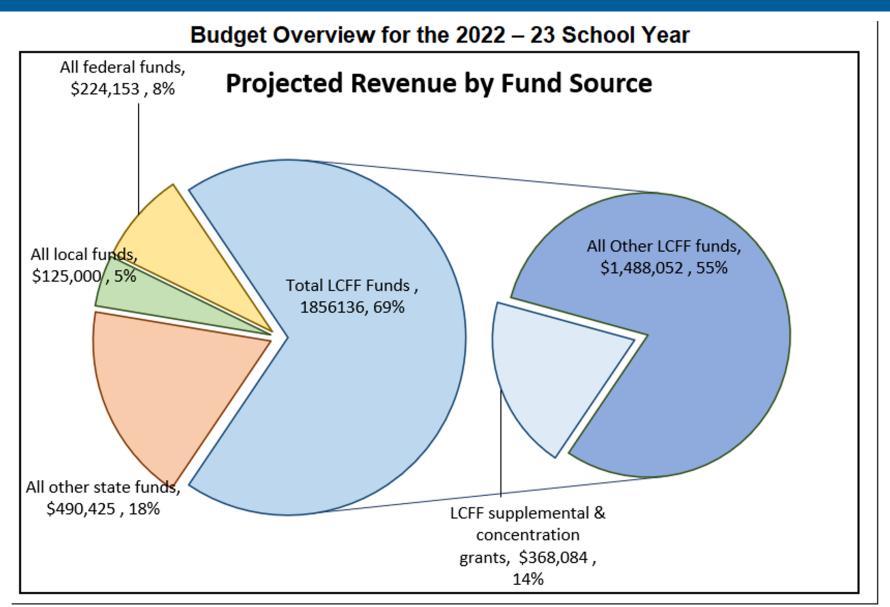

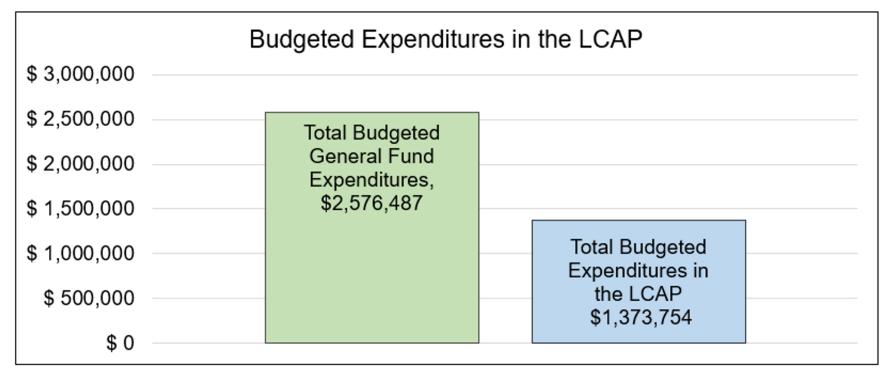

Goal 1: Academic Achievement Implementation Successes & Challenges

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Successes	Challenges
Teachers still felt supported despite the reduced frequency of coaching sessions.	Due to staffing and logistical challenges with the pandemic, coaches were not able to always meet with mentees 2-3 each week.
By adding full-time support from Small Group Instructors, we have been able to better differentiate our instruction to the needs of our students and to increase the opportunities for students to ask questions, to practice, and to progress more rapidly in their skills development.	One challenge is the need to make sure that all of our instructors understand data-driven instruction. We are working to build this capacity through staff development.
We have been excited to observe that our small group instructors are able to replicate some of our school's best practices.	Providing consistent high-quality instruction to students when many students were required to quarantine during high COVID-19 transmission periods and transitioned to independent study, which allowed continuity of instruction, but not with the same quality as required by our youngest scholars to thrive.
